

| Regional Overview | Operational situation appears largely unchanged overnight, with no new terminal attacks or port closures. Strait of Hormuz traffic remains severely disrupted, and shipping companies continue to avoid transits through the Strait of Hormuz amid elevated security risks. Airspace remains closed in most Gulf countries, and where it is open/partially open, flight cancellations severely limit the possibility of crew changes. | | | | | |

| UAE | Fully operational | Ruwais PPA ISPS Level 2 All other ports ISPS 1 | Open - Limited | • Al Maktoum International Airport and Dubai International Airport have resumed a small number of flights. | • Jebel Ali, Hamriya, and Sharjah Port, all terminal port operations are normal. • Fujairah and Khor Fakkan, Local port authorities have not issued any alerts at this time. However, navigational warning No. 01/2026 has been disseminated, addressing reported incidents of intermittent GPS signal spoofing and jamming in offshore areas of Fujairah. These disruptions may lead to a loss of positional accuracy, erratic vessel movements on Electronic Chart Display and Information Systems (ECDIS), and potentially misleading positional information. Mariners are advised to consider this area as high risk. All port operations are now proceeding as normal, including activities at the Fujairah Oil Tanker Terminal and the Adco SPM Terminal. Bunkering Operations - We have not received any formal notifications of force majeure from the local port authority or bunker suppliers. Services at the anchorage of Fujairah and Khor Fakkan continue without interruption. • Ras Al Khaimah Ports remain open and are operating normally. • Ruwais and Abu Dhabi petroleum ports are operational. Ruwais PPA (ISPS level 2) & Abu Dhabi Ports (ISPS Level 1). Abu Dhabi Ports confirmed that all UAE ports managed and operated by AD ports remain fully open and are operating as usual. • Limited airport operations have resumed with a small number of flights operating from DXB and DWC. Passengers must not travel to the airport unless they have received a confirmed departure time directly from their airline, as schedules remain subject to change. | Kuwait | Fully operational | Shuwaikh and Shuaiba Port ISPS Level 2 All other ports ISPS 1 | Temporarily Closed | • Shuaiba crew change is restricted. • Shuwaikh is allowed basis prior approval and only with movements to and from hotel. | • No alerts/notifications/circulars from the Kuwait Port authorities. • Presently no stoppage of operations reported, and no official information from the port authorities. • Shuaiba Port ISPS Level: 2 • Shuwaikh Port ISPS Level: 2 • Air space closed temporarily | 06/03/2026 - 10:30 |
| Oman | Partial restrictions | ISPS 1 | Open | • Airspace is open; however, some airlines have cancelled their flights, impacting crew change arrangements. | • Current Status: No alerts/notifications have been issued by the local authorities. • Ports working normally: Port Sultan Qaboos, Muscat, Mina Al Fahal, Port of Sohar, Qalhat LNG Terminal - Sur, OMIFCO Terminal - Sur, Port of Salalah, Port of Duqm, Asyad Drydock - Duqm • ISPS Level: 1 • Airspace remains open, although some international flight routes have been suspended | 06/03/2026 - 08:00 |
| Saudi Arabia | Fully operational | ISPS 1 | Open | • Flights to 8 countries suspended. Some incoming flights from Gulf countries are suspended due to their local airspace closures. | • There are presently no alerts or warnings issued by the local port authorities. All operational activities are functioning at full capacity. • Saudi Arabia's national carrier confirmed flights suspended for Bahrain, Kuwait, Amman, Dubai, Abu Dhabi, Doha, Russia and Peshawar. | 06/03/2026 - 10:00 |
| Bahrain | Gradual resumption of operations | ISPS 1 | Temporarily Closed | • No crew change possible | • Due to several attacks in Bahrain since early morning, all vessel movements are currently suspended. (updated) • At present, crew changes are not feasible as the airspace remains closed. • ISPS security level remains at Level 1. | 06/03/2026 - 11:00 |
| Qatar | Fully operational | ISPS 1 | Temporarily Closed | • Qatar's airspace remains closed and all air travel are still suspended due to the current circumstances. Government authorities also strongly advised to avoid road travels due to the high safety risk. All individuals are requested to stay indoors unless absolutely necessary to go out. • Qatar crew change is allowed, subject to movements to and from the hotel. | • Hamad Port, Doha Port, Al Ruwais Port - Normal port operations and vessel movement. Al Ruwais Port is restricted to small craft only, including dhows and barges. • Mesaieed Port and Ras Laffan Port - Port operations ongoing. Qatar Energy has ceased production of LNG and associated products. • Al Shaheen Terminal and Halul Island Terminal - Operations suspended until further notice. Al Shaheen Terminal: Suspension confirmed via email from North Oil. Halul Island Terminal: Suspension confirmed via email from Qatar Energy Halul. • The official security status remains at Security Level 1. | Egypt | Fully operational | ISPS 1 | Open | • Flight cancellations to high risk destinations. | • Impact on travel (air and land): Nil; however, National airlines (Egyptair) announced suspension of all its flights to/from Gulf countries till further notice. | 06/03/2026 10:18 |
| Jordan | Fully operational | ISPS 1 | Open | • Flight cancellations to high risk destinations. | • Jordan remains stable. Authorities continue to issue general public awareness guidelines purely as precautionary measures. There are no security incidents inside Jordan. • Jordan has closed its airspace from 18:00 to 09:00 It daily, effective immediately and until further notice. This affects arriving, departing, and transit flights within the closure window. • All operations remain normal at Aqaba Port. Terminals, marine services, cargo handling, and gate operations are functioning without disruption. Maritime navigation and cargo operations are proceeding smoothly and without delay. • Jordan airspace is fully open as opposed to the previous partial closure. • Flights to Syria, Iraq, the UAE, Bahrain, Kuwait, and Qatar remain suspended due to airspace closures in those countries. Royal Jordanian advises passengers to check flight status online before heading to the airport, as schedules may change on short notice. | 06/03/2026 11:00 |
| Pakistan | Fully operational | ISPS 1 | Open | • None | • All Ports / Terminals / Shipping movements are operational as usual. | 06/03/2026 11:00 |
| Iraq | Fully operational | ISPS 1 | Open | • None | • No damage at Umm Qasr. • Basra Oil Terminal has requested a 100% production reduction from South Rumaila due to a shortage of available tankers, resulting from the deterrence of oil tankers entering the Arabian Gulf basin and full onshore storage. The export of crude oil will be stopped after the completion of the current vessel cargo ops. • No port restrictions or emergency measures in place. • Fresh water supply available • Food purchasing/provisioning available • Crew change is available, but there is a delay in issuing the visa. • Shore leave (for emergency medical treatment, etc.) available. | 06/03/2026 11:00 |
| Cyprus | Fully operational | ISPS 1 | Open | • None | • All ports remain fully operational. • ISPS level remains at Level 1. • Airports and airspace remain open, with no operational impact reported (some flights are being cancelled on a daily basis). | Lebanon | Fully operational | ISPS 1 | Open | • None | • All ports remain operational, with no alerts or warnings issued by the local port authorities so far. South of Lebanon is in an unstable operational situation. • ISPS level remains at Level 1. • Airspace remains open and operating only Middle East Airlines flights. • All private & public sectors are working normally. | 05/03/2026 - 13:38 |
| Israel | Fully operational | ISPS 1 | Open / Restricted | • No crew change possible | • Besides restrictions on DG, every port is working as normal. • No ship has left Israel or was forced to leave outside its schedule • Airspace is now open but restricted. Flights are coming in and out of Israel on a limited basis, with restrictions (max 50 pax out per flight), landing every hour, operating 24 hours a day. | 05/03/2026 - 13:38 |
